

TECHNICAL CONVENTIONS

Sanskrit terms

As in A.K. Warder's *Indian Buddhism* (1970), I have given **priority to Sanskrit terms**. The *Critical Pali Dictionary* (1924-), the PTS *Pali-English Dictionary* (1925) and Cone's *Dictionary of Pali* (2001-) all give Sanskrit (i.e. Vedic, Classical Sanskrit and Buddhist Sanskrit) equivalents of the Pali terms.

The main aims of this approach are to give a broader historical feeling to this study and to encourage a “comparative study” of Buddhism from both Pali and Sanskrit sources. However useful Pali may be, it is still the textual language of only one school of Buddhism, the Theravāda. Moreover, Sanskrit (in whatever form) is a more universal scholarly (and as such more accurate) language. As a rule, an understanding of Sanskrit (especially Buddhist Sanskrit) helps in the better understanding of the Pali terms and context.

For example, in the etymology of *satipatthāna* which is *smṛtyupasthāna* in Sanskrit, where from the Sanskrit, we have a good idea that it is resolved as *sati + upatthāna* (and not *sati + patthāna*).

Another example is the translation of words like *dīpa* in *atta,dīpa* in the Mahāparinibbāna Sutta (D 2:100) is more correctly rendered as “island” rather than “lamp”, that is, as confirmed by the Sanskrit contexts, such as the Mahāvastu (Senart, Mvst 1:334)

Technical terms are given as *Sanskrit/Pali*, for example, *karma/kamma*, or “Sanskrit (Pali)”, for example, Śāriputra (Sāriputta). When the both the Sanskrit and Pali terms are identical (*tatsama*), then only one form is used, e.g. *chanda*.

In the translations of **Pali texts** and their contexts, I have maintained the Pali terms (giving the Sanskrit equivalents within parentheses, where necessary).

Textual references

References are given as **vol:page** of the Pali Text Society editions, e.g. “**V 1:20**” means “the Vinaya volume 1 page 20 of the Pali text”.

In other cases, where a **lower case numbers separated by a period** refer to the internal division of the books referring to a whole sutta or title, e.g. “**S 45.2**” means “Samyutta Nikāya chapter 45 (Magga Samyutta) sutta 2”, that is, the Upadīha Sutta on spiritual friendship.

Text lines are given in Arabic numerals, e.g. “**S 1:196,11-21**” means “Samyutta Nikāya (PTS edition) volume 1, page 196, lines 11-21”.

Stanza lines are referred to as **a b c d**, etc., that is, line 1, 2, 3, 4 respectively, e.g. “**Sn 650a**” means “Sutta Nipāta stanza no. 650, first line”.

Cross-references (within this book)

Cross-references within this work is given with square brackets as [Lecture:section/s], for example, [2:6] or [Lecture 2:6] means “see Lecture (or Chapter) 2 section 6”. Within the same lecture or chapter itself, a cross-reference is simply given, for example, as [6], that is, “see section 6” of the same lecture or chapter.

Reading lists

Recommended titles in the bibliography or reading list are preceded by an asterisk (*).

To locate a reference mentioned in the text, first look up the author's name and then the latest edition year of the book.

For other abbreviations and textual conventions, refer to Piyasilo's *Guide to Buddhist Studies*, 1990 (unpublished MSS) or relevant Buddhist websites, such as www.palitext.demon.co.uk (the Pali Text Society) or www.sunderland.ac.uk (“Information on Pali Literature...”).
